
# Saturday Morning Coffee

between roughly 1885 and 1915 American sailors visiting the orient could obtain beautiful needlework embroideries on shore, with patriotic American Themes, mementos of a long voyage, usually bought as a gift for a loved one. The piece is elaborately embroidered in silk thread on a silk background. The 43 star flags place it being made in the year 1890






The **M1917 Enfield**, the "American Enfield", formally named "**United States Rifle, cal .30, Model of 1917**" is an American modification and production of the British .303 caliber rifle (listed in British Service as Rifle No. 3) developed and manufactured during the period 1917–1918. Upon our entry into WWI, the US had only enough M1903 "Springfield" rifles to equip about 10% of our infantry units. So we adopted and modified a British rifle (that we were already manufacturing at Remington, Winchester and Eddystone for Britain) for our 30-06 caliber cartridges. Numerically, it was the main rifle used by the American Expeditionary Forces in Europe during World War I. The Danish Army still uses the M1917, which performs reliably in Greenland/Arctic conditions, as their service weapon.





## Veterans Day (Weekend) Museum November 2018

Once again the Library and Historical Collections Committee pulled out all the stops, filling the main hall and both streets with educational exhibits and hands-on vehicles. The themes this year were the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Tet Offensive and the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the ending of WWI. A special ceremony was held on November 11<sup>th</sup> at 11:00 am, the exact time of the signing of the Armistice ending World War I in 1918 that included poems, bell ringing and moment of silence.
